

Protecting your Banking Details

Europe Arab Bank plc will never ask you to disclose your banking or personal details by email, or request these details through a third party.

You may receive emails that request that you provide your banking details to Europe Arab Bank plc. For example, you may be told that you have won an amount of money in a lottery draw, and will need to provide your banking details to the email address or website stated in the email.

These emails are fraudulent, and are probably sent from criminals trying to steal your information.

These emails often include a false website address and will take you through to a site which is in fact a 'copy' of the EAB website. Creating false websites is referred to as 'spoofing'. These websites can often be identified by their incorrect web addresses, which may simply appear as a string of numbers.

Aside from attempting to steal your information, 'spoofed' sites often download malicious programs, such as viruses, to your computer. If you receive a link you believe is fraudulent, Europe Arab Bank advises that you do not click on the link, even if you do not intend to enter your information.

The correct Europe Arab Bank website address is www.eabplc.com

The people sending these emails will attempt to send the same message to as many email addresses as they can find, in the hope that the recipient will then provide their banking details to an email address that appears to be Europe Arab Bank, but in fact is not.

Never give your banking or personal details away and do not respond to such emails.
